Motivations

My motivation is based on my deep and sincere intent to contribute to a stronger society through democratic means. I have an absolute commitment to the Open Government Declaration, its form and objectives. I would consider it a privilege to be able to take my experience and put it to a broader social benefit. My professional experience has long been in the transformation of organizations and self managing leadership to achieve new value. I have an extensive background in corporate organizations having long used technology to improve customer outcomes and benefits. My current role is in a public sector organization again leading strategy and innovation in how government acts as custodian of civic assets to achieve the best outcomes for citizens. I am committed to the sharing of information, customer participation in government service, values by design and accountability.

Selection Criteria

- Demonstrated support of OGP's vision and the Open Government Declaration
In terms of demonstrated support for the vision and strategy of OGP, from a background of global change delivery, I have deliberately joined the public service to participate in the development of open government making stronger democratic decisions.
- Expertise relevant to the Open Government Partnership
I have a diverse background educationally, professionally and experientially: I have lived in a number of countries and thereby learned much about the criticality of openness to allow for the diverse population to contribute to the democratic process. My education is in political science and philosophical logic; followed by a Masters of Management in cross-cultural trade. My deep interest in democratic systems and principals is longstanding.
